

USA SHOOTING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING HALL OF FAME
ELECTION PROCEDURES

A. CRITERIA FOR NOMINATION

1. An athlete nominee must be retired for more than five years from active international competition.
2. The nominee is to have produced consistent winning performances in major ISSF competition with emphasis on the Olympic Games and World Shooting championships. Consideration is also to be afforded winning performances over several years in other ISSF events such as World Cup Finals, World Clay Target Championships, and Pan American Games. Special consideration will be given to identifying pre-1948 shooter athletes.
3. A non-shooter nominee shall have made a significant contribution to the shooting sport over several years.
4. All nominees shall have demonstrated exemplary conduct as a person. Their contributions to the international shooting sports shall have been significant.

B. NOMINATION PROCEDURES

1. Nominations to the International Shooting Hall of Fame, election and induction will take place once during the quadrennial, typically following the Olympic Games.
2. Nominations will be solicited from the USAS Shooting Board of Directors and members of the International Shooting Hall of Fame during the Olympic year. The USA Shooting staff will select a slate of candidates from those nominated.
3. A minimum of six candidates will be nominated.
4. The nomination process will be initiated in a timely manner relevant to the induction ceremony.

C. ELECTION PROCEDURES

1. The USA Shooting staff will select a listing of candidates from those nominated in a relevant time frame for the year of election.

2. All current members of the USA Shooting Board of Directors and inducted members of the Shooting Hall of Fame are eligible to vote. Proxy votes are not permissible.
3. Ballots will be mailed to all eligible voters in a timely manner relevant to the induction ceremony. Ballots must be returned as specified on the ballot, normally within 21 days.
4. Each voting member may vote for up to three nominees. In the event of a tie vote, the election outcome will be determined using a telephonic vote of all eligible voters if time does not allow for voting by mail.
5. The two nominees receiving the most votes will be inducted into the International Shooting Hall of Fame.

D. INDUCTION CEREMONY

1. An induction ceremony will take place in conjunction with an appropriate event sponsored by USA Shooting. That activity will normally be the annual industry SHOT Show or a special event following the Olympic Games.
2. USA Shooting will pay travel and lodging expenses for each inductee and one guest to attend the ceremony.

E. LIFE MEMBERSHIP

1. Hall of Fame inductees will be provided honorary life membership to USA Shooting. They will receive all associated benefits and recognition provided with life membership.
2. Hall of Fame members inducted prior to 2000 will be provided life membership retroactively. Those Hall members will also receive all associated benefits and recognition provided with life membership.
